Rome Rises On Charles St. / Aphrodite Smiles

Rome captivates with its light, its romance, its fascination, and its intrigue. Wendy Artin, Boston native and graduate of the Museum School of the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, has been under the spell of Rome for the past six years. She has explored the city in watercolors and drawings and now brings to Boston Rome's weather-beaten classical statues, timeless ruins, open-air markets, and more.

She does this with sensitive interpretation and a technique that honors her inspiration, Rome, ideal in the tradition of classical Western art. Her watercolors and drawings exhibit wonderful tonality and use of shadow.

Russ Gerrard, owner and director of Gurari Collections on Charles Street, has honored Beacon Hill by welcoming Artin. The current show contains 60 sepia and sanguine watercolors on Indian jute and

cotton paper, along with large-format oil washes on canvas. The show takes its name from the Artin work, "Aphrodite," which magically comes alive and changes expression with changing light.
